### From the Desk of Rev. Jo-Ann

As I begin my third year at North Battleford, I realize that I have finally settled into this urban setting. It was a struggle to deal with the sound of traffic, horns blaring and children in the street rather than wildlife on the road. I recognize most of the faces that attend church regularly and have gotten to know the names of those who sit on the committees. I still struggle with some names but even after 16 years in Rosetown there were some names that never got to the tip of my tongue. When I arrived here, I found a congregation that was exhausted from dealing with the pandemic and working very hard to follow the protocols that were set out to resume public activities; it was hard for some people to move away from those precautions as the world began to leave the pandemic behind and much easier for others.

What I have noticed in the past year with leaving some of those safety measures behind is that, as a whole, we all have more colds, flu symptoms and sick days than we did when we sanitized our hands every time, we entered a new space or wore masks when out in public. However, I am not ready to go back to wearing a mask regularly. Since I got ran down and was sick last week, I recognize that we do need to take care of ourselves as we enter cold and flu season and activities at the church begin once again. Take time for rest and eat as healthy as you possible can; I know it is not always easy.

With that little preaching done with I want to hold up my other observation; as a church some people have used the slow down during the pandemic to step away and not be as active. I enjoy doing hospital visits and I have appreciated those families that have invited me into the final days of their loved one's journeys; this is a helpful process if I am asked to do a funeral service. Being active in worship is one thing but for the success of the church we need help with fundraisers like our suppers or craft fair or even knew ideas. We also need help to fulfil Christ mission of reaching out into the world and helping those in need. Come talk to me how can we reach out and make an impact in our community. How can we keep our church financially stable and do the outreach that many people are interested in. Come talk to me let's find a project and make a Christ like difference in this community we call home.
