From Dexter's Desk ~ Rev. Dexter van Dyke

This newsletter is being published as we are about to enter the season of Lent. Part of the letter's purpose is to provide you with information about the activities and worship services that will happen during this time. Lent is the forty days, not counting Sundays, before Easter. Sundays are not included because they are understood to be mini celebrations of the resurrection and Easter. Like Advent, Lent is meant to be a penitential time of spiritual preparation. The forty days parallel the forty days Jesus spent being tempted in the wilderness and the forty years the people of Israel spent wandering in the desert.

In recent years I have come to understand the penitential seasons in a significantly different way than I had previously understood them. In this new way of seeing things I understand Lent to be a time of examining our lives and our ways of living, individually and collectively, a time of seeking a deeper understanding of God's ways and purposes. Where our ways are not in accord with God's ways it is a time of turning toward God. We encounter this idea in the hymn "Tis the Gift to Be Simple" (# 353 VU) - "to turn, turn will be our delight 'til by turning, turning, we come round right. Engaging in the common practise of giving up something or perhaps of undertaking a new commitment is one way of approaching the Lenten season. It is my experience that this is useful only if it serves as a way of focusing ourselves on the larger task of self examination. Lent is not meant to be a time of punishing ourselves or beating ourselves up either emotionally or spiritually and certainly not physically.

When Jesus was asked, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself. When asked, "and who is my neighbour?' He replied with the story we have come to know as the Parable of the Good Samaritan. (Luke 10: 25 -37) This summary of the law is my starting point as I seek to understand God's purposes for my life and for the world. I know that I am able to love God because God first loved me (1John 4:10) and it is that great love which informs my love of myself and my love of my neighbour. God does not require great offerings or sacrifices burnt or otherwise. What God asks is that I walk humbly, that I love kindness and that I seek justice not just for myself but for everyone and everything. (Micah 6:6) May you and I know the blessing of God's great love and presence as we undertake our Lenten journey. May we be open to God's grace and love and be channels of that love and grace for those around us.
