We decided to do this special service as part of regular Sunday worship so that service will be full with it being the first Sunday of Advent, covenanting, and communion with a lunch to follow. This is what I call a full meal deal. I hope to see as many people as possible out for this special service and time.

So as we move closer to Advent and the Christmas season it is a time to remember what Christmas is all about. Which means one really does need to experience the season of Advent where we anticipate and wait for the coming of the Christ child once again.

Thus I leave you with this thought: "Wake up! God is near. Wake up! God is HERE." Let us prepare for the coming of our Lord and know that God is HERE and we are called to worship the God that created us and loves us.
